Highlights of Program Implementation For CY 2012

Sustainable Livelihood Program is a capacity building program which seeks to improve and enhance the socio-economic capacities of the disadvantaged families especially the Pantawid Pamilya beneficiaries either through micro-enterprise development and employment facilitation. It aims to improve the socio-economic capacity to improve access to basic services and improve the standard of living involving partners such NGAs, NGOs, CSOs, MFIs and Business Groups.

1. Released Php6,207,500.00 for seed capital of 1,103 family beneficiaries under the Self-Employment Assistance-Kaunlaran(SEA-K) Financing Scheme :
